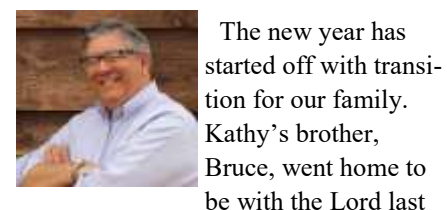

In fact, I am writing this article from the front seat as Kathy drives us to Shawnee for Bruce's service of celebration that I will lead Monday afternoon. Kathy's brother had Down syndrome and had a limited mental capacity but his love capacity was unlimited. My message this afternoon is titled, A Valuable Life. Some in our world don't see much value in the lives of people with mental and physical disability but Bruce's life had incredible value. It started with his parents who valued him from the womb. When told they should just put him in an institution and forget about him, they chose not to do so, but rather to love and nurture him. Psalm 139 says that we are fearfully and wonderfully made and that God has a plan and purpose for every life. This month we observe Sanctity of Human Life on January 20th which acknowledges the value of the life from the womb to the tomb. We must stand in the gap for those who cannot stand for themselves. Next Sunday when we see our Special Ministries folks in our worship service, I want you to see them with a different set of eyes. Not as an annoyance or a problem, but see them as incredible people of value and get to know them. Your life will be better for it. Kathy and I thank you for all your prayers and expressions of love. Let me start by saying a big thank you to our church family and staff. I have been amazed at the love and support that has been shown to me ever since we made the announcement in August that I would be leaving. The original plan in July was that I would sing with the group and still be able to lead worship at PABC. Through a crazy process we were finally able to get to that point. I'm very appreciative and elated to stay in the music ministry at Portland Avenue and even more elated to be home more with my wife and children.

For over a year our Wednesday night bible study group has been praying for my brother in law Rick. Rick was diagnosed with an aggressive form of cancer in November 2016 that eventually spread to his brain this past fall. We have always prayed for his cancer situation, but more importantly his need for salvation. I have shared with Rick on several occasions, but he had never (to my knowledge) accepted Christ as his Savior.

A few days ago I received the call that doctors had done all they could do. I immediately went to the hospital with the intent of being very blunt about his need for salvation. What I did not know was that the cancer had made him unresponsive and incoherent. He was awake though and I prayed that God please let him hear me. I went through God's plan of salvation and told him how to accept Jesus into his heart. I have no idea if he even heard or not, but I place that in God's hands. What I do know is that within minutes he had a peace about him and calmed down; and within 12 hours he peacefully passed away.

My encouragement to each of you is to never wait for the right moments to share the gospel with someone. Don't give up sharing your faith, even when it seems they may not hear it. And when you get the opportunity be blunt and bold - this decision is the most important decision that person will ever make.

Growing a Gospel-Centered Family Requires Firm Footing on the Foundation of God's Word.

One of the ways a child gains firm footing is through the regular reading of God's Word. In our high-tech world, electronics, handheld devices and bright screens are often more appealing to children than picking up a book of any kind. Below are few things you should know about cultivating a climate of Bible reading in your home.



- 1. Live it out.** Telling your child to read the Bible will fall on deaf ears if he does not see you reading it for yourself. Children should see that their parents are Bible readers.
- 2. Establish a routine.** Whether at the breakfast table, right before bed or some time in between, reading the Bible as a family helps children immerse in the truths and stories of Scripture. You may think that Bible reading is lost on a fidgety toddler, but when you establish a routine of family Bible readings, your child will expect it as he or she grows older.
- 3. Share God's Word regularly.** Deuteronomy 6:6-9 says that the truth of God's Word is to be impressed on our children and that we are to instruct our children in a natural way—as we sit around the house, as we walk around, as we lie down, and as we rise. The written Word should be an ordinary and visible part of everyday family living.

Children pick up on and often mimic the habits of those closest to them. They are more likely to read their Bibles if their parents read the Bible with them. If you truly believe in the importance of reading the Bible and if you want your child to grow into an adult who reads the Bible, be diligent to instill the habit of reading Scripture.
